### Helping Babies Far & Near

"The Makers" are assembling layettes (things babies need) for the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota and Dodge County.

Ninety percent of people in the Pine Ridge Reservation live below the poverty level, with an annual income of around \$4,000.00. Due to lack of opportunity, and the cycle of poverty, many pregnant women do not have basic items when their babies are born. Layettes are given to mothers when they bring their babies home from the hospital.

As an Eagle Scout Project, Grace member Barret Shier has secured space at Dodge County Human Services for social workers to provide "Emergency Cub Kits". These will be given to babies who are placed in emergency Foster Care. These babies come with limited belongings and are placed with licensed foster care families on short notice. Having a layette will make their transition more comfortable. The Makers are providing things they can make like blankets, toys, bibs and burp cloths. We invite Grace members to provide the rest of the layette. Items will be collected until Father's day, June 16. (continued)
